The S/E ensemble comes in the spring and can become a 'last minute thought, so here are a few reasons to keep it in mind throughout the year.

Reasons for students to participate:

- To gain specific feedback from a third party concerning technique and musical interpretation
- To build confidence and 'desensitize' the butterflies in solo or small group performance in a safe environment
- To experiment with or stretch repertoire and performance vocabulary
- To present ones self in a different venue and bearing from the school
- More performance opportunities are the quickest and most effective way to improve
- To have a reason to work on solo literature, or to work in a chamber ensemble
- To have an opportunity to hear and see other students from other schools perform a variety of repertoire
- To open the door for other performance opportunities in the community or even, possibly, being able to attend the State Solo and Ensemble Festival as well as add to the students growing resume for that college or job application

Reasons for teachers to encourage students to partipate:

- To use for enrichment, including requiring honors students to participate, use as one of the criteria for a school music scholarship, to gain points leading to the school letter
- An opportunity to connect with private teachers for student contacts or as clinicians in the classroom

- To fulfill the needs of small ensemble opportunities as stated in the standards
- To add the extra experience that your advanced students need in order to grow
- Another bonding opportunity with students
- To use the depth of your knolwedge, if the teacher chooses to coach the students.

I was fortunate, although I didn't know it at the time. My high school choir teacher announced that everyone in Madrigals should enter our local Solo and Ensemble Festival. He assigned each student a solo from "Twentyfour Italian Songs and Arias", and I taught myself a tune - and Italian. The performance was in a hall of about 250 - 300 people and we waited for our time, went in, performed, worked with the adjudicators for a few minutes, and joined the audience. One of the voice teachers in the town heard me, called my mom (it was a small town) and said that even though his studio was full, he wanted to know if I would ever be interested in lessons. A few months later, I followed up and my life took a huge zig in the road leading me to rich music experiences, opera houses, concert halls, and opportunities working with incredible people from all over the world. Now maybe my life would have been just as interesting working in a pathology lab, but I had a teacher who told me to learn a song.

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Solo and Ensemble Festival Policy Change

Recorded Accompanimnt Offers Opportunities for More Students Lara Levy, Instrumental Music Director, Monterey High School

Change is in the air! During the CCS Board Planning Retreat this past August, the members of the board had a discussion regarding the purpose and goal of the Solo and Ensemble Festivals. In an effort to encourage more students to participate, a vote was cast in favor of changing a long time policy about the use of recorded accompaniment for solo works. Previously, all accompaniment had to be provided live. While working with an accompanist is an immensely valuable experience - especially for those students who plan to continue on in music - we came to realize that this rule might be keeping students who might otherwise be interested in participating from entering in these events. In the spirit of equity and accessibility, recorded accompaniment is now being allowed at our area festivals. Students who wish to perform at the State level must still use live accompaniment. Here are some resources for recorded accompaniment:

Music Minus One - This is one of the most well established of all the sites. This site offers a huge selection of recorded music both for solo instruments and ensembles. There are a variety of options for the recordings. Some offer recordings in a split-channel format, with the solo in the right channel and the accompaniment in the left channel. This allows students to play along with the solo part, or fade it out. Some have tracks that are just the accompaniment. Several pieces have a special -20% slow tempo version for practicing. Everything available on the site is digital, so it is avaailble for you to start using immediately after purchase, although it looks like you can still purchase hard copies. You can purchase these minus one packages through most music retailers, or check out the MMO site at digital. musicminusone.com for more information.

Piano-Accompaniments.com - This site has piano accompaniment tracks for a wide variety of classical music. Slower practice versions are available for some of the pieces, and some include clicks during rests. These can be removed using an audio editing program like Audacity, or by the creator of this site. It looks like this site only has the accompaniment parts, and that links to the public domain parts at IMSLP are provided for the sheet music. Check out the site at www.piano-accompaniments.com for more information.

VirtualSheetMusic.com - This site is very similar to the others, just with slightly different offerings. This site offers piano reductions with metronome lead in and slower versions to practice with. The recordings are in MP3 format. They have a free sheet music section which might be worth glancing through. Check out www.virtualsheetmusic.com for more information.

YourAccompanist.com - This site is for vocalists! There are many tracks available for opera, operetta, lieder, and art songs. This site offer instant downloads after purchase, and DRM free MP3s (can be used on any device). These tracks are actual piano recordings, not MIDI.

Standard of Excellence - Free accompaniment recordings for books 1 & 2! It's never too early to start the little ones on their quest for Solo and Ensemble superiority, is it? Did I mention they're free? Check out www.kjos.com/band soe accomp.htm for more information.
